Jerry Montoya has worked in professional theater as a playwright, director and producer for the past 30 years. During the pandemic a play about his multi-generational family, NOSOTROS LA GENTE, was commissioned and produced by American Stage in St. Petersburg, Florida as part of their re-imagine series and his play LOVE AND BASEBALL is now a feature film streaming on HBO/Max. For B Street he recently directed BYHALIA, MISSISSIPPI, which closed prematurely due to the COVID-19 pandemic. In the new theater he has helmed JUMP, THE FLYING MACHINE: THE STORY OF THE WRIGHT BROTHERS, HOLMES AND WATSON and THE LEGEND OF GEORGIA MCBRIDE, as well as many others at the old B Street including: A SKULL IN CONNEMARA, RED, THE SEAFARER and he has written 13 plays for the Family Series including MARTIN LUTHER KING AND THE SOUND OF FREEDOM, TREASURE ISLAND, THE FLYING MACHINE, FRANKENSTEIN and his original play about Harriet Tubman, THE CONDUCTOR, has seen two productions at B Street.
